# Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) Overview

#### **PARCC**

- Massachusetts is one of 21 states working to develop the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)
- An assessment aligned to Common Core State Standards
- An assessment anchored in knowledge and skills students need to be ready for college and careers

### What will PARCC assess?

- Standards contained in the 2011 Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks in English Language Arts and Literacy (ELA) and Mathematics (incorporating CCSS)
- Includes innovative technology-based items and performance-based items that intend to assess a broad range of the skills that we value and employers report are necessary for students to be successful after high school

# Two Types of Assessment

Performance Based Assessments (PBA)

End of Year Assessments (EOY)

### Performance Based Assessments (PBA)

- ELA: literature analysis, narrative writing, and research simulation tasks.
- Students will read passages and demonstrate that they can:
  - Read and understand sufficiently complex tasks independently
  - Write effectively when using and analyzing sources
  - Build and communicate knowledge by integrating, comparing, and synthesizing ideas

### Performance Based Assessments (PBA)

- Mathematics Involves tasks requiring students to demonstrate they can:
  - Solve problems involving key knowledge and skills
  - Express mathematical reasoning and construct mathematical arguments
  - Apply concepts to solve/model real-world problems

### **End of Year Assessments (EOY)**

#### • ELA EOY requires students to:

- Demonstrate their ability to comprehend a range of sufficiently complex text, including literature, literary non-fiction, and informal text from history/social studies, science, and technical subjects
- Engage in the reading of texts that require them to draw conclusions
- Interpret the meaning of words and phrases and technical vocabulary
- Compare, integrate, and synthesize ideas presented in texts

### **End of Year Assessments (EOY)**

- Mathematics EOY requires students to:
  - Demonstrate their ability to solve multi-step problems, conceptual questions, applications, and carry out substantial procedures

### **Transition to PARCC**

- MA DESE envisions a transition period to move from MCAS assessments to PARCC.
- Later this fall, the MA Board of Elementary and Secondary Education will discuss and vote on a transition plan with the understanding that the state will only adopt PARCC if it proves to be as good as or better than our current MCAS assessments.
- PARCC will only assess Math and ELA, anticipate MCAS continuing for other content areas

# **Technical Requirements**

- PARCC will be administered primarily on-line
  - Paper and Pencil options will exist during a transition period
  - Field testing will include on-line and paper and pencil versions of the assessment
- Sudbury meets technical requirements within anticipated administration window

### 2013-14 PARCC Field Test

#### • Why Field Test?

- Examine the quality of items to build assessment forms for FY15 administration
- Test administration procedures
- Provide opportunity for schools/districts to experience administration of PARCC assessments
- PARCC will administer a field test in spring 2014 to a representative sample of about 10 percent of Massachusetts students in grades 3-11.
- No student, school, or district data will be provided from field testing

# Field Testing in Sudbury

- Two assessments field tested (PBA and EOY)
- All five SPS schools have been selected to participate in the field testing
- Details regarding administration of the field test and selection of the specific classrooms involved will be available beginning in November
- Field Test Window
  - o PBA (Math and ELA) March 24-April 11, 2014
  - o EOY (Math and ELA) − May 5-June 6, 2014
